



## **DURING THE HOLOCAUST...**

- The Nazi's ideology and tactics began with discrimination and ended in genocide.
- Ordinary people witnessed atrocities, yet many chose to remain silent—betraying their neighbors. Rather than resist, they looked away and allowed genocide. The Nazis murdered 6 million Jews.
- An additional 5 million people were also killed, including Soviet, Polish and Serb civilians; people with disabilities; Sinti and Roma (Gypsies); Jehovah's Witnesses; and "criminals" and "asocials" (e.g., nonconformists, pacifists and homosexuals).
- The word "holocaust" means "sacrifice by fire".

## TODAY...

- South Sudan's civil war and ethnic cleansing have displaced 4 million people. Estimates of the dead range from 50,000 to 300,000.
- 1.4 million Christians lived in Iraq in 2003. Today, there are only 275,000.
- 1.2 million Rohingya Muslims have fled deadly persecution in Myanmar.
- The Roma *still* face grave human rights abuses in Europe.
- Hate crimes in the U.S. are rising, with more than 20% motivated by religious bigotry against Jews, Muslims and other religious minorities.
