What is Combating Extremism?

Tanenbaum's *Combating Extremism* campaign is a public education initiative that combats alienating stereotypes, fake news and other disinformation, while offering building blocks for the respect that we all want and deserve—no matter who we are or what we believe.

What are Tanenbaum's Combating Extremism resources?

Tanenbaum's *Combating Extremism* resources include <u>a guide for holding challenging conversations</u> and free informational materials and question sheets on topics related to extremism, such as religious diversity, stereotyping, and terrorism.

What's the purpose of these resources?

Our resources help reduce prejudice, hate, and terror by facilitating open and respectful conversations on hard issues related to extremism. They promote critical thinking and compassionate global citizenship by enabling people with different beliefs and perspectives to come together in a safe environment and address the hard questions we usually avoid.

Who should use these resources?

These resources are for the general public, and they can be used by anyone who's ready to have an open discussion on issues related to extremism, including parents, teachers, clergy, and community leaders.

How can I use these resources?

These resources are flexible, and you are welcome to use them in whatever way you see fit. They can be adapted according to the particular goals and characteristics of your discussion group. Clergy can draw from them for sermons. Houses of worship can use them for internal study. Teachers can adapt them for their lessons. To provide you with more ideas, Tanenbaum has developed detailed <u>Guidelines for Conducting Open Conversations</u>, as well as a summary of these guidelines.

Do the resources promote a particular political or religious agenda?
