Unable to join us in person? A live-stream component will be made available.

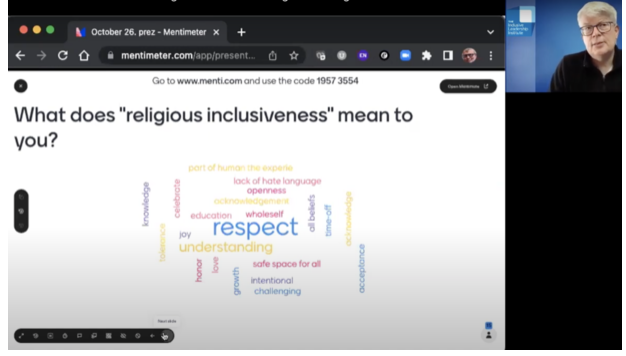

In partnership with Tanenbaum, the Initiative on Islam and Medicine ([II&M](#).) hosted '[Advancing Equity for Muslim Physicians in the Healthcare Workforce](#).' This webinar highlights a [decade of II&M's research](#) on religious discrimination and the impact it has on the professional and psychological outcomes for Muslim physicians in the workplace.
