

TANENBAUM'S 2023 YEAR IN REVIEW

PEACEBUILDING

- Created a Peacemakers in Action Podcast Discussion Guide for Season 1 of Peacemakers in Action Podcast series.
- Tanenbaum CEO Rev. Mark Fowler moderated a panel on Peacebuilding and Conflict Resolution featuring Dr. Scott Appleby, Katherine Marshall, and Dr. Marc Gopin at the 2023 Religion and Foreign Policy Workshop in May.
- Recorded Tanenbaum Peacemaker in Action Dr. Sarah AK Ahmed's case study audio about her peacebuilding work in Irag in March.
- Tanenbaum held a webinar with Tanenbaum Peacemakers in Action Dr. Sakena Yacoobi and Dr. Sarah AK Ahmed as part of the NGO Commission on the Status of Women.
- Together, Tanenbaum and KAICIID hosted a Women in Diplomacy webinar featuring *Peacemaker in Action* Hind Kabawat in July.
- → Tanenbaum CEO Rev. Mark Fowler and Peacemakers in Action Dr. Sarah AK Ahmed and Rev. Dr. William "Bill" Lowrey participated in 2 panels in August at the Parliament of the World's Religions Convening in Chicago.
- → Tanenbaum and Peacemaker in Action Yehezkel Landau presented peacebuilding tools and techniques at Manhattan College's Holocaust, Genocide and Interfaith Education Center in October.
- → Together with the Aurora Humanitarian Initiative, presented "Faith in Humanity: Religion as a Uniting Force for Good" webinar featuring Peacemaker in Action Dr. Sarah AK Ahmed in November.













HEALTH CARE

- The Health Care program welcomed two new Nonprofit Leaders, UT Austin MD Anderson Cancer Center and Westchester Medical Center Health Network.
- The Health Care program doubled the number of hospitals included in its Membership network.
- → With the generous support of the E. Rhodes and Leona B. Carpenter Foundation, the Health Care program shared its newly updated residency curricula module LGBTQ+ Youth Health: The Role of Religion at the Planetree International Conference in Boston, MA in October.
- + The Health Care program developed and facilitated new clinical provider and staff focused trainings, including:
 - o Religion as a Social Determinant of Health
 - o Intersections of Religious and LGBTQ+ Identities in Health Care
 - o Navigating Social Identities with Interreligious Awareness
 - o The December Dilemma: Maximizing Opportunities in Health Care

EXECUTIVE OFFICE

- Tanenbaum signed onto Alliance for Peacebuilding Letter to Congress to provide funding for peacebuilding and conflict and atrocities prevention in the Fiscal Year 2024 appropriations bill.
- → Tanenbaum held a *Religicide* Book Event in partnership with Tanenbaum Founder and President Dr. Georgette F. Bennett and His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros, the Archdiocese of the Greek Orthodox Church of America.
- → Tanenbaum CEO Rev. Mark Fowler participated in a panel at U.S. Department of Education Center for Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships.





EDUCATION

- → Gave testimony at the New York City Council Committee on Education and Public Safety in favor of Resolution 476, which calls upon the NYC Department of Education to provide all grade levels with a curriculum that focuses on religious diversity education. Additionally, it offers professional development training to staff and educators to address the rise of anti-religious hate crimes in NYC public schools.
- Published Transforming Conflict, a new core education curriculum, in July. To date, the curriculum has reached over 26,000 students nationwide. Generously funded by the Nissan Foundation, the Pine Tree Foundation of New York, the Sy Syms Foundation, and the Munshi Bishan Singh Kochhar (MBSK) Foundation.
- + Expanded the Education Advisory Board to
 13 teachers in sites in New York, New Jersey,
 Michigan, Ohio, North Carolina, Georgia, Texas,
 and Washington who collectively reach almost
 1,200 students. Generously funded by the Nissan
 Foundation, the Wayfarer Foundation, and the
 Munshi Bishan Singh Kochhar (MBSK) Foundation.
- Delivered professional development workshops to New York City Public School teachers representing all five boroughs, reaching approximately 150 educators in total.
- Advised the Children's Museum Houston, an institution reaching over 850,000 children per year, on its "Faithful Friends" exhibition opening in 2024.







WORKPLACE

- + Hosted first-ever hybrid Religious Diversity Leadership Summit in May 2023, convening 6 sessions with 9 subject matter experts sharing about critical areas of workplace religious diversity for nearly 800 participants.
- Expanded the Tanenbaum Membership Program to over 65 client member companies and nonprofits.
- + Hosted briefing on current events, with 4 sessions exploring intersectional issues of global relevance including companies responses to the war between Israel and Hamas. **More than 100** Chief Diversity Officers, Chief Human Resources Officers, and Executive Sponsors participated.
- + Delivered **over 40 presentations to 15,000 employees** of varying levels, transferring important knowledge and skills to audiences worldwide.





DEVELOPMENT

- Tanenbaum's events including Divinely Inspired: Celebrating our Differences through Art, Summer Soirée, Coffees with Mark, and 2023 Gala: Peace Made Possible provided space for conversation, hope, and action throughout the year.
- We expanded programmatic impact in 2023, realizing an 80% increase in grant funding for critical projects.
